WHEREAS, on March 4, 1996, Governor John Engler appointed Lowell Perry to serve as the Director of the Office of Urban Programs; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Perry was an All American Football Player at the University of Michigan where he received his bachelors degree and recently inducted into the Football Hall of Honor; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Perry played, coached and scouted for the Pittsburgh Steelers in the National Football League; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Perry serves on the National Football League Board of Charities, the Boys & Girls Club of Southeast Michigan and former member of the Detroit College of Law Board of Trustees; and
