

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR OF THE WASHTENAW COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO SIGN AN AGREEMENT WITH INGHAM COUNTY UNDER THE URBAN COOPERATION AGREEMENT ACT TO ENABLE INGHAM COUNTY TO PROVIDE BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER CONTROL PROGRAM (BCCCP) SERVICES IN WASHTENAW COUNTY

WASHTENAW COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

September 1, 1999

WHEREAS, Washtenaw County Public Health Department has provided BCCCP services to County residents for seven years; and

WHEREAS, the BCCCP provides free breast and cervical cancer screenings to women ages 40 to 64 years of age who meet insurance and income status qualifications; and

WHEREAS, reductions in federal funding have made it impossible to effectively meet program requirements and coordinate a single county or small multi-county program; and

WHEREAS, the Public Health Department has determined that becoming a large regional coordination program is not a viable option for us due to lack of sufficient adjacent service areas; and

WHEREAS, Ingham County is willing to expand their region of BCCCP services to include Washtenaw County; and

WHEREAS, this recommended change will cause no disruption in the delivery of BCCCP services in Washtenaw County; and

WHEREAS, Ingham County legal counsel requires the signing of an agreement between Ingham and Washtenaw Counties pursuant to the Urban Cooperation Act prior to initiating service delivery in other counties; and

WHEREAS, this matter has been reviewed by the Finance Department, Corporation Counsel, Human Resources, County Administration and the Ways and Means Committee

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners authorizes the Chair of the Board to sign the Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Program Agreement with Ingham County as on file with the County Clerk

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Public Health Department prepare a resolution for Board action approving the necessary program changes including position modifications, budget modifications and agreements between Ingham and Washtenaw Counties to successfully implement the proposed program transition for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 1999.
