A RESOLUTION APPOINTING REPRESENTATION TO THE COMMERCIAL/ INDUSTRIAL PROGRAM TASK FORCE FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SOLID WASTE PLAN FOR THE PERIOD OF 18 MONTHS

WASHTENAW COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

October 17, 2001

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners approved the Washtenaw County Solid Waste Management Plan 1999 Update (Plan Update) in May of 2000 and adopted minor revisions requested by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality on July 18, 2001 (resolution 01-0150); and

WHEREAS, the Plan Update seeks to decrease the amount of Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) generated per capita in Washtenaw County by 10% and increase the MSW diversion rate in Washtenaw County to 45% by the year 2010; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners in the past has delegated authority for Solid Waste Plan implementation to the Washtenaw County Board of Public Works and the Division of Public Works; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Update calls for the creation of a Commercial/Industrial Program Task Force (CIPTF) to decrease commercial/industrial waste generation rates and increase commercial/industrial recovery rates, with terms not to exceed eighteen (18) months from the date of the first meeting; and

WHEREAS, the CIPTF will develop an Implementation Action Plan to decrease waste generation and increase resource recovery rates in Washtenaw County and submit this Implementation Action Plan to the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners, through the Washtenaw County Board of Public Works, for consideration and action within 12 months of the first meeting of the CIPTF; and

WHEREAS, per the Plan Update the CIPTF shall include representatives from commercial, industrial, and institutional entities within three key industry sectors: Manufacturing, Retail/Wholesale, and Services and additional members will be sought from a wide cross-section of stakeholders, including the county, local municipalities, SEMCOG, waste and recycling industry and the general public

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners hereby appoints 10 representatives to the Commercial/Industrial Program Task Force for the period of 18 months from the first meeting of the CIPTF as follows:
