

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE HIRING OF RICHARD GUDKESE AS WASHTENAW COUNTY DIRECTOR OF FACILITIES MANAGEMENT, EFFECTIVE JANUARY 7, 2002, AT AN ANNUAL SALARY OF \$86,255, ABOVE MID-POINT OF GRADE 34, GROUP 32

WASHTENAW COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, the Director of Facilities Management transferred to another department; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Facilities Management was posted in compliance with County policy, and the County Administrator directed the Deputy County Administrator to appoint and serve on a panel to conduct interviews of candidates for the position; and

WHEREAS, the panel unanimously determined that Richard Gudkese, former Executive Director of Facilities Management for the Bay Medical Center, Bay City, Michigan from 1981 to present, was the candidate of choice; and

WHEREAS, Richard Gudkese brings to the Washtenaw County Facilities Management 20 years of professional experience as a facilities management administrator in all aspects of construction management, building maintenance, equipment and grounds maintenance; and

WHEREAS, in addition, Richard Gudkese, is also an electrical engineer by profession; and

WHEREAS, Richard Gudkese will commence as Washtenaw County Director of Facilities Management on January 7, 2002; and

WHEREAS, Richards Gudkese will be hired at an annual salary of \$86,255 an amount above the mid-point of Grade 34 and afforded all benefits applicable to Group 32 non-union; and

WHEREAS, the starting salary of \$86,255 can be absorbed within the existing Facilities Management budget; and

WHEREAS, this mater has been reviewed by Corporation Counsel, the Finance Department, Human Resources, the County Administrator's Office and the Ways & Means Committee

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the hiring of Richard Gudkese as the Washtenaw County Facilities Management Director effective January 7, 2002 at an annual salary of \$86,255, above mid-point of Grade 34, Group 32
