## Background-Previous Board Action

### Outside Agency funding

- Since 1984
- Currently \$300,000 annually
- Only not-for-profits may apply

#### Children's Well-being funding

- Since 1998
- Currently \$700,000 annually
- Only outside agencies or other units of government may apply

#### Board Action for 2006-07

- Allocated \$550,000/yr. for CWB programming
- Allocated \$225,000/yr for NFP programming
- Combined RFQ/RFP issued September 2005:
  - Based upon BOC priorities & community plans
- RFQ/RFP submitted in October 2005
  - Review Team: Funder's Forum subcommittee (Directors of DHS, AAACF, WUW, WCHO)
- Presented to BOC on 11/16/05
- Upon BOC approval, programs began 1/1/06

# Relationship to Board Priorities – Communities of Interest

- Board of Commissioners' Communities of Interest and related funding priorities:

#### Outcomes Based RFP Process

#### The Rensselaerville Institute (TRI) Model:

- Explored by County, Ann Arbor Community
   Foundation, City of Ann Arbor, United Way in 2000
- Pioneered by Substance Abuse Coordinating Agency in 2001
- Extensive training for not-for-profits 2001 to present
- Implemented for CWB-Outside Agency RFP for 2002-2003 funding cycle
- Also adopted by the City of Ann Arbor, AAACF, Pfizer, James A. & Faith Knight Foundation

## Rating Process for 2008-2009:

- Reviewers read and rate proposals using the Communitygrants.org system
- System allows for comments and questions to and from reviewers during the review process
- Reviewers meet to discuss and finalize the recommendation
  - Develop consensus around ratings
  - Prioritize programs until funding is expended
  - Re-prioritize grant amounts to include more programs
  - Reaffirm consensus around rating and grant amounts
