"The Strategy should provide the flexibility to adapt to global economic conditions, fully utilize the community's unique advantages to attract private investment and maximize economic opportunity for our residents."

CEDS Overview

 The U.S. Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration (EDA) requires the development of a CEDS in order to apply for EDA's Investment Programs.

Feds want to see that grant applications fit into a bigger economic development strategy for the region. Funding opportunities include:

incubator facilities revolving loan funds workforce training centers research park infrastructure rehabilitation of older industrial buildings cluster industry training needs
