WHEREAS, effective January 1, 2000, Washtenaw County implemented a new JD Edwards Human Resources / Payroll (JDE) system to avoid Y2K related problems as the MSA Payroll / Personnel System (MSA) was not Y2K compliant; and

WHEREAS, over the course of the last three (3) months, Finance, Human Resources and Information & Technology Services staff have been working closely with JD Edwards and Payroll/Human Resources consultants in an effort to correct related problems, as well as to better define internal workflow to achieve better efficiency and effectiveness with the system; and

WHEREAS, the transition from MSA to JDE has been extremely problematic, thus causing the Finance Department to completely realign its workflow and staffing. It was also apparent that the JDE application is expansive in the information one can access and control / manipulate.

An analysis of workflow and business practices in the Finance – Payables Division and Human Resources was conducted. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 4(b) OF THE WASHTENAW COUNTY EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO ALLOW INDIVIDUALS, WHO ARE MEMBERS OF THE WASHTENAW COUNTY MONEY PURCHASE PENSION PLAN AND WHO WERE PREVIOUSLY MEMBERS OF THE WASHTENAW COUNTY EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM, TO BECOME MEMBERS IN THE WASHTENAW COUNTY EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM:

Be it ordained that the Board of Commissioners of the County of Washtenaw that Section 4(b) of the Washtenaw County Employees Retirement System is hereby amended to read as follows:

(b) Any former member (vested or non-vested) who elected to withdraw from the membership of the Retirement System and is an active member in the Washtenaw County Money Purchase Pension Plan, shall have the option of reacquiring membership in the Retirement System subject to the following:

- (i) The individual must be employed in an included position;
- (ii) The individual must submit a completed membership application to the Retirement System by June 1, 2001, or as otherwise provided pursuant to collective bargaining agreement;
- (iii) The individual must pay to the Retirement System in a lump sum the total amount of accumulated contributions previously withdrawn by the individual from the Retirement System, if any; and
- (iv) The individual must transfer all amounts standing to his/her credit in the Washtenaw County Money Purchase Pension Plan to the Retirement System. An individual must complete the appropriate documentation to authorize and effectuate said transfer of funds.

Upon approval of the individual's application for membership by the Retirement Commission, (1) the individual shall become a member as of the first pay period 14 days following satisfaction of the foregoing requirements; (2) the member shall be credited with that amount of service credit previously forfeited; and (3) the member shall receive credit for the period of time he/she was a member of the Washtenaw County Money Purchase Pension Plan. An individual who becomes a member of the Retirement System in accordance with this provision and has met the eligibility requirements for retirement may retire from the Retirement System no earlier than 30 days after becoming a member of the Retirement System.

The Board of Commissioners hereby appoints and authorizes the Retirement Commission to administer the terms and conditions of this Ordinance.

All interested parties are hereby notified that this Ordinance shall be effective until June 1, 2001 and that an application for membership in WCERS must be received on or before June 1, 2001. Application for membership will not be accepted after that date.

**AGREEMENT CREATING THE
WASHTENAW CENTRAL DISPATCH AND
TECHNOLOGY AUTHORITY**

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ARTICLE I – AUTHORITY

- 1.1 The County of Washtenaw and the State of Michigan enter into this agreement as of the _____ day of _____, 2000.
- 1.2 The parties hereby create a new legal entity to be known as the **Washtenaw Central Dispatch and Technology Authority** (hereafter, the “Authority”), by powers granted to them by the State of Michigan, including M.C.L.A. 124.501 et. seq.
- 1.3 Upon approval, this agreement supersedes the Agreement Creating a Central Dispatch Authority For Washtenaw County dated the 8th day of March, 1990.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

- 2.1 The purpose of this authority is to form partnerships to increase communications and coordination between entities providing public services in the Washtenaw County area while using technology and economy of scale to control costs. The primary focus shall be to provide support in the areas of dispatch, communications, and information technology services to criminal justice, fire suppression, and emergency medical service agencies. The Board of Directors of the Authority shall determine the specific types of service provided based on the needs and interests of the community.
- 2.2 The Authority shall support the Washtenaw County Enhanced 9-1-1 Service Plan by offering services to entities eligible to participate in the plan. Other public agencies may receive services from the authority if approved by the Board of Directors.
- 2.3 The County of Washtenaw and State of Michigan desire to maintain a Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) and provide for the centralized dispatch of law enforcement, fire, and emergency medical services (EMS) within Washtenaw County through the formation of a Consolidated Dispatch Center as defined in M.C.L.A. 484.1102 et. seq.

ARTICLE III - DEFINITIONS

As used in this Agreement, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- 3.1 **“Authority”** refers to the Washtenaw County Central Dispatch and Technology Authority.
- 3.2 **“Board”** refers to the Board of Directors of the Authority, as described in this agreement.
- 3.3 **“Budget”** refers to the annual fiscal plan regarding anticipated revenues and expenditures of the Authority adopted by the Board.
- 3.4 **“Capital Contribution”** shall mean funds contributed to the Authority to purchase land or real property, equipment, or technology infrastructure. It shall not mean operating expenses.
- 3.5 **“Executive Director”** shall mean a person appointed by the Board of Directors to manage the operations of the Authority, as defined in section 7.1. This person shall not be a director appointed by a member agency.
- 3.6 **“Fiscal Year”** refers to the period of time in which the Authority’s annual budget shall be effective and shall be concurrent with the calendar year.
- 3.7 **“Majority”** means one (1) more than half of those eligible to vote.
- 3.8 **“Private Agency”** refers to a private entity that provides fire, ambulance or other emergency medical services.
- 3.9 **“Properly Convened Meeting”** refers to a Board meeting where a quorum is present and which was the subject of five days prior notice to each member.
- 3.10 **“Public Agency”** refers to a department of state government, a county, or any village, township, charter township, or city or any special purpose district.
- 3.11 **“Public Safety Answering Point”** or **“PSAP”** refers to a communications facility operated on a 24-hour basis; assigned responsibility to receive both emergency and non-emergency requests for service, and assigned responsibility to process service requests by means of the direct dispatch, relay or transfer method.
- 3.12 A **“Quorum”** shall consist of one (1) more than half of those eligible to vote.

ARTICLE IV – MEMBERSHIP

- 4.1 **Membership.** The membership of the Authority shall be:
- 4.1.1 All public police and fire departments in Washtenaw County.
 - 4.1.2 Huron Valley Ambulance, as long as they provide emergency medical services within Washtenaw County.
 - 4.1.3 Any other public or private agency approved by the Authority Board of Directors. The Board shall also have the right to revoke this membership.
- 4.2 **Membership Rights.** Membership in the Authority shall mean the right to participate in and receive service from the Authority. Membership, in and of itself, however, implies no obligation on any individual member to receive or accept services, or to pay costs to the Authority.
- 4.3 **Membership Types.** There shall be three types of membership in the authority.
- 4.4.1 **Founding Member.** A Founding Member shall be a person or entity specified in section 5.3.1, excluding law enforcement agencies not specifically enumerated.
 - 4.4.2 **Contributing Member.** A Contributing Member shall be an entity that provides monetary support to the Authority.
 - 4.4.3 **General Member.** A General Member shall be all other members not defined above.
- 4.4 **Participation.** It is left to each member entity to determine the level to which they choose to participate in the Authority.

ARTICLE V - GOVERNANCE

5.1 **Intent.** The Authority is a diverse organization that is designed to meet both the present and future needs of the Washtenaw County Public Safety and Criminal Justice communities. It is the intent of this agreement to create a governing Board that represents a wide variety of interests in the community, including both current and potential participants. The objective is to include as many viewpoints as practical in the planning and organizing process, with final decisions being made by those participants that elect to receive the service. The agreement is structured to allow local entities the greatest flexibility in determining how the Authority can support them in their mission.

5.2 **Board of Directors.** The Authority shall be governed by a Board of Directors.

5.3 The Board of Directors shall be composed of the following:

5.3.1 **Directors.** Directors shall have the right to speak at Board meetings, serve on Committees and Working Groups, and cast votes on matters decided by the Board.

Directors shall be:

A representative appointed by the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners.

A representative of the Michigan Department of State Police (MSP) appointed by the Director of the Michigan State Police.

A representative appointed by the Washtenaw Chapter of the Michigan Townships Association.

A representative of cities and villages within Washtenaw County, to be appointed by the Authority Board.

A Fire Department Chief selected by the Washtenaw Area Mutual Aid Association Chiefs Committee. If possible, this representative should be a contributing member of the Authority.

The Chief Executive Officer of Huron Valley Ambulance, Inc., the non-profit, community owned Washtenaw County Emergency Medical Service contractor, or his/her designated representative.

The Washtenaw County Sheriff, or his/her designated representative.

The Washtenaw County Prosecuting Attorney, or his/her designated representative.

A representative of each law enforcement contributing member, if not represented above.

A representative of the general public, to be appointed by the Authority Board.

- 5.3.2 **Associate Directors.** Associate directors shall have the right to speak at Board meetings and serve on Committees and Working Groups, but shall not have the right to cast votes on matters decided by the Board.

Associate Directors shall be:

A representative of each member not described in 5.3.1.

- 5.4 **Alternates.** With the exception of the director representing the general public, each Board member shall have an alternate who may attend all Board, Committee, or Working Group meetings and may vote in the absence of the member. The alternate shall be appointed in the same manner as the member, and shall serve for the same term.
- 5.5 **Selection of Directors.** Upon approval of this agreement, each member shall have the right to appoint a representative to the Board of Directors. With the exception of the directors representing cities and villages and the general public, the directors shall be selected by the entity being represented. The directors representing the cities and villages and the general public shall be selected by the other members of the Board at the first meeting of the Board in each odd-numbered year.
- 5.6 **Terms of Directors.** All Executive Board members shall serve at the pleasure of the entity that appointed them and may be reappointed or replaced at any time by that entity. With the exception of the initial term that begins upon approval of this agreement, the Directors appointed by the Authority Board shall serve for a term of two years beginning in January of each odd numbered year.
- 5.7 **Powers.** In addition to policy-making power and any other power expressly conferred herein, the Board is empowered to perform, but not limited to, the following functions for the Authority, to facilitate the purpose of this Agreement:
- 5.7.1 Construct, acquire, manage, own, use, operate, maintain, lease, or sell real or personal property.
 - 5.7.2 Enter into contracts with approval of the Authority legal counsel.
 - 5.7.3 Employ, engage, compensate, transfer, or discharge personnel as necessary.

- 5.7.4 Contract for the provision of manpower, dispatching, technology, equipment, and administrative services.
 - 5.7.5 Receive and administer grants, gifts, bequests, or assistance funds.
 - 5.7.6 Incur operational liabilities.
 - 5.7.7 Prepare and approve the Authority's annual budget.
 - 5.7.8 Obtain insurance coverage.
 - 5.7.9 Contract with participants to provide service to them in exchange for financial or other contributions.
 - 5.7.10 Dispose, divide or distribute any property acquired through the execution of this agreement.
- 5.8 **Limitations.** Notwithstanding the above, the authority of the Board shall be limited to binding the Authority and making policy for the Authority. The Board shall not have authority to make policy for any other entity, or to commit, disburse, or encumber the funds and/or resources of public and private agencies or public safety agencies. The authority shall not be empowered to levy or access any type of tax, or to issue any type of bond.
- 5.9 **Meetings.** The Board shall meet at least quarterly with a mandatory meeting in January and October. The Board may meet more frequently, as needed, and may conduct regular business at any properly convened meeting. At the January meeting the Board shall elect a Chair, a First Vice-Chair, a Second Vice-Chair, and a Third Vice-Chair from its membership to serve for one calendar year. At the October meeting the Board shall adopt a budget for the following fiscal year (January 1 through December 31).
- 5.9.1 **Board Chair.** The Board Chair shall preside over Board meetings, and cause minutes of each Board meeting to be kept and distributed to each member.
- 5.9.2 **First Vice-Chair.** The first Vice-Chair shall carry out the duties of the Chair in the event the Chair is absent and/or unable to carry out his/her duties and responsibilities. The First Vice-Chair shall also perform such duties as may be designated by the Chair.

5.9.3 **Second Vice-Chair.** The second Vice-Chair shall carry out the duties of the Chair in the event the Chair and First Vice-Chair are absent and/or unable to carry out his/her duties and responsibilities. The Second Vice-Chair shall also perform such duties as may be designated by the Chair.

5.9.4 **Third Vice-Chair.** The third Vice-Chair shall carry out the duties of the Chair in the event the Chair, the First Vice-Chair, and the Second Vice-Chair are absent and/or unable to carry out his/her duties and responsibilities. The Third Vice-Chair shall also perform such duties as may be designated by the Chair.

5.10 **Quorum.** A quorum shall consist of one (1) more than half of those eligible to vote.

5.11 **Board Action.** The Board shall not take any action except at a properly convened meeting at which a quorum is present. Action is to be taken by the affirmative vote of a majority of the voting members of the Board. Each voting Board Member shall have one vote. Directors representing contributing members shall not have a vote on issues that deal exclusively with services that they have elected not to participate in. Proxy voting, except as expressed in section 5.4, shall not be allowed. At the discretion of the chair, Board actions may be approved by roll call vote, to ensure that policy is set by members who are authorized to vote.

5.12 **Minutes.** The Board Chair shall cause minutes of each Board meeting to be kept and distributed to each member.

5.13 **Compensation.** Directors shall serve without compensation from the Authority. Expenses, when authorized by the appointing agency, shall be paid by the appointing agency. This section shall not apply to the Executive Director.

ARTICLE VI – COMMITTEES AND WORKING GROUPS

6.1 **Standing Committees.** The Authority shall have three permanent committees. Committees shall be comprised of Authority directors or their alternates. The Board Chair may create and dissolve additional committees as needed.

6.1.1 **Finance Committee.** The Finance Committee shall be responsible for making financial recommendations to the Board of Directors. Responsibilities shall include recommending a yearly budget, development of financing mechanisms, and any other responsibilities designated by the Board. The committee shall be made up of Board members appointed by the Board of Directors.

6.1.2 **Personnel Committee.** The Personnel Committee shall be responsible for making recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding personnel matters. Responsibilities shall include development and maintenance of personnel policy, recommendations of labor agreements, and any other responsibilities designated by the Board. The committee shall be made up of Board members appointed by the Board of Directors.

6.1.3 **LEIN/AFIS Committee.** The LEIN/AFIS Committee shall be responsible for all policy and operational matters related to the operation of LEIN and AFIS terminals. The committee shall be made up of the Chief or Director from each participating law enforcement member agency. To insure compliance with R 28.5204 of the Michigan Administrative Code governing the Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN), management control of access to LEIN/NCIC/NLETS/AFIS shall be delegated to this committee. The decisions of the committee shall be final and are not subject to review by the Board.

6.2 **Working Groups.** Working Groups shall be committees designed to advise the Board on technical and operational issues. The working groups shall be made up of members of the public safety community with expertise in the assigned area, field personnel, and Authority service providers. Members may be appointed by the Board, the Executive Director, or the Chair of the Working Group. The working groups shall also serve as user advisory committees and shall be responsible for quality control.

There shall be three permanent working groups. The Board may create and dissolve additional working groups as the need arises.

6.2.1 **Technical Working Group.** The Technical Working Group shall address technical issues and make recommendations to the Board of Directors on technical matters.

6.2.2 **Law Enforcement Operational Working Group.** The Law Enforcement Operational Working Group shall address law enforcement operational issues and make recommendations to the Board of Directors on law enforcement matters.

6.2.3 **Fire/Medical Operational Working Group.** The Fire / Medical Operational Working Group shall address fire and medical operational issues and make recommendations to the Board of Directors on fire and medical matters.

6.3 **Committee and Working Group Recommendations.** Recommendations made to the Board of Directors shall be by a majority of committee or working group members present when the recommendations are finalized. Dissenting committee or working group members may present minority opinions to the Board.

- 6.4 **Committee and Working Group Leadership.** Each Committee and Working Group shall elect a Chair and Vice-Chair by majority vote. These officers shall be elected at the first meeting of each year. The Chair shall call meetings as needed or directed by the Board and shall preside over those meetings. The Vice-Chair shall carry out the duties of the Chair in the event the Chair is absent and/or unable to carry out his/her duties. The Vice-Chair shall also perform such duties as may be designated by the Chair.
- 6.5 **Committee and Working Group Minutes.** The Chair of each committee and working group shall cause minutes of each meeting to be prepared and distributed to all committee or working group members.

ARTICLE VII – OPERATIONS

- 7.1 **Executive Director.** The Board shall appoint an Executive Director to manage the operations of the Authority. The Executive Director is the chief operating officer of the Authority and is directly responsible to the Board for implementing policy and procedures adopted by the Board, facilitating and coordinating committee and working group activities, and other duties as directed by the Board. Other duties shall include preparation of the annual budget, accounting of the financial operations of the Authority, and supervision of the operations of the Authority.
- The Executive Director shall be a non-voting, ex-officio member of the Board and shall attend all Board meetings unless excused by a Board officer. He/she shall also be a voting member of all Authority committees and working groups.
- 7.2 **Contract Services.** The Authority may contract with the County, or other public or private agencies for support services including, but not limited to finance, legal, and personnel services.
- 7.3 **User Agreements.** The Authority may create user agreements with municipalities and private agencies interested in receiving services from the Authority. Each user agreement shall specify the contribution, if any, to the Authority to be made by the Agency during the term of the agreement, and will specify the services that are to be rendered by the Authority.
- 7.4 **Financial Support.** The Authority may receive financial support from one or more sources, including emergency telephone surcharge revenues, user fees, and public or private grants.

- 7.5 **Transferred Employees.** Employees transferred to the Authority as a result of the implementation of this agreement or a future user agreement shall have all the rights and privileges provided by law or labor agreement. This shall include seniority, sick leave, vacation, insurance, and pension credits.

ARTICLE VIII - FISCAL ADMINISTRATION

- 8.1 **Fiscal Agent.** Unless otherwise designated by the Board, all power to receive, hold, and actually disburse funds or money equivalents shall be exercised for the Authority by the County of Washtenaw under the same controls and policies that it applies to all other funds or equivalents for which it is responsible. The County of Washtenaw shall provide the Authority with reasonable information on the state of the Authority's finances and with respect to particular transactions. The Authority may contract with other public or private agencies for financial and support services if approved by the Board.
- 8.2 **Budget.** For each fiscal year, in accordance with the County's budget schedule, the Board shall approve an Authority budget that shall be a line-item budget in accordance with the Uniform Budget and Accounting Act.
- 8.3 **Annual Audit.** In accordance with Michigan state law, the Authority revenues and expenditures shall be subject to a complete annual audit which will include an audit opinion without qualifications, to be performed by a certified public accountant.

ARTICLE IX - MISCELLANEOUS

- 9.1 **Extent of Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes the complete expression of the Agreement between the parties. There are no other oral or written agreements or understandings between the parties concerning the subject matter of this Agreement.
- 9.2 **Severability.** This agreement shall be interpreted in a manner consistent with applicable law. If any portion is held to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable, the remainder of the Agreement shall be deemed severable and shall remain in full force and effect.

- 9.3 **Non Waiver.** Participation in the Authority by any member does not waive any of their legal rights or defenses with respect to any third party or parties. Moreover, members do not expressly or impliedly assume any liability for each other or any third party.
- 9.4 **Amendments.** Amendments to this Agreement must be proposed by the Board of Directors and approved, in writing, by the County of Washtenaw and the State of Michigan.
- 9.5 **Duration.** This Agreement shall continue in force for ten years, unless earlier terminated by either the County of Washtenaw or the State of Michigan. Either party shall have the right to terminate the agreement by providing the other party with at least one year's written notice of termination.
- 9.6 **Termination, Distribution of Assets.** Upon termination of this agreement, title to all property owned by the authority shall vest in the Washtenaw County and the State of Michigan, which incorporated it, in proportion to the percentage of capital contribution contributed by those entities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners directs the division of Public Works to forward the Plan Update to Washtenaw County Communities for their consideration

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon approval of 2/3 of the communities within Washtenaw County, the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners directs the Division of Public Works to forward the Plan Update to the MDEQ for their consideration.
