RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

An adjourned session of the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners was held at the Administration Building, in the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, on Wednesday, October 18, 2006.

The meeting was called to order at 9:03 p.m. by Wesley Prater, Chair of the Board.

Lee Tooson stated that he knows he is in the right place, because this is the organization that controls the money. He asked the board to grant him both five minute speaking periods at the beginning of the meeting.

The board expressed their consent for this.

Mr. Tooson stated that he would like the board to use energy to build good relationships between the board, the sheriff and the black community. He asked if Sheriff Minzey has asked the board for sensitivity training and diversity training, and if so, has the board responded. He stated that if the board has not given the sheriff the tools he needs, such as sensitivity and diversity training, then they are as guilty as the police that killed Mr. Lee.

Stephanie Davis she thanked the board for listening to her concerns, and stated that she feels relieved by the boards reaction to her input.

Comm. Gunn stated that she had asked the sheriff to make a request for sensitivity training, but he turned it down. She stated that the power to do more lies with the voters of Washtenaw County.
