WHEREAS, Community Support and Treatment Services currently operates a jail diversion program as part of Public Safety and Justice Recommendations; and

WHEREAS, homelessness, poverty and jail overcrowding have reached an unprecedented level in Washtenaw County, approximately 17,000 Washtenaw County residents have a serious and persistent mental illness, further Michigan Department of Community Health estimates that approximately 31,000 residents live with alcohol or drug abuse dependency; and

WHEREAS, this population regularly has contact with the criminal justice system and frequently re-offends along with gaps in service to this population and a chronically overcrowded jail contribute to the barriers preventing positive change; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the project is to increase public safety through collaborative efforts of the justice system and the community mental health system to provide a complete team based continuum of services for a vulnerable at-risk population; and

WHEREAS, the funding for the implementation and expansion project will solidify and expand services to eliminate the criminalization of the mentally ill in the Washtenaw County Jail; and

WHEREAS, the expansion of services will address gaps in the current model including: protecting the public safety by early intervention, increasing in-jail psychiatric assessments and treatment, and increasing psychiatric nursing services available in the community to allow for health and nutritional education and medication management once individuals leave the jail; and

WHEREAS, the Washtenaw County Public Health Department has been funded by the Michigan Department of Community Health's Cardiovascular Health, Nutrition, and Physical Activity Section, "Washtenaw Steps Up" as part of its Comprehensive Plan and Budget Contract (CPBC) for our Washtenaw Steps Up program for the past three years; and

WHEREAS, the Washtenaw County Public Health Department also receives funding for the Building Healthy Communities funding for 2009-2010 through the Comprehensive Planning and Budgeting Agreement with the Michigan Department of Community Health; and

WHEREAS, for the past three years, Washtenaw County Public Health has received Michigan State University (MSU) Extension's Food Stamp Nutrition Education (FSNE), now referred to as Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program-Nutrition Education (SNAP-Ed) to complement Washtenaw Steps Up funding; and

WHEREAS, to accomplish the objective of the SNAP-Ed program to increase consumption of fruits, vegetables, and low- or fat-free milk, Washtenaw County Public Health will conduct nutrition education and outreach through various strategies to targeted seniors and parents with children at 10 food pantries in Washtenaw County; and

WHEREAS, this matter has been reviewed by Corporation Counsel, the Finance Department, Human Resources, the County Administrator's Office, and the Ways and Means Committee.

WHEREAS, the County of Washtenaw (the "County") by resolution of its Board of Commissioners has approved the issuance by the Michigan Avenue East Central Area Drain Drainage District (the "District") of its Michigan Avenue East Central Area Drain Drainage District Bonds, Series 2009 in the total principal amount of not to exceed \$1,720,000 (the "Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, Bond Counsel has prepared this resolution and Continuing Disclosure Certificate (the "Disclosure Certificate") which Disclosure Certificate is attached as Appendix A.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHTENAW as follows:

1. This Board of Commissioners, for and on behalf of the County of Washtenaw, hereby covenants and agrees, for the benefit of the beneficial owners of the Bonds to be issued by the District, to enter into a written undertaking (the "Undertaking") required by Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities and Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Rule") to provide continuing disclosure of certain financial information and operating data and timely notices of the occurrence of certain events in accordance with the Rule. The Undertaking shall be substantially in the form attached hereto as Appendix A. The Undertaking shall be enforceable by the beneficial owners of the Bonds or by the Underwriter on behalf of such beneficial owners (provided that the Underwriter's right to enforce the provisions of the Undertaking shall be limited to a right to obtain specific enforcement of the County's obligations hereunder and under the Undertaking), and any failure

by the County to comply with the provisions of the Undertaking shall not be deemed a default with respect to the Bonds.

The County Administrator, County Finance Director, County Water Resources Commissioner or County Clerk shall provide a Continuing Disclosure Certificate for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings, setting forth the terms of the County's Undertaking.

2. The Disclosure Certificate attached as Appendix A is hereby approved as is the execution thereof by the designated officials.

3. All resolutions, or portions thereof, insofar as they may be in conflict with the foregoing, are hereby rescinded.

This Continuing Disclosure Certificate (the "Disclosure Certificate") is executed and delivered by the **County of Washtenaw** (the "County") in connection with the issuance of the Michigan Avenue East Central Area Drain Drainage District (the "Issuer") of its **\$1,720,000 Michigan Avenue East Central Area Drain Drainage District Bonds, Series 2009** (the "Securities"). The Securities are being issued pursuant to a resolution adopted by the Governing Body of the Issuer on \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_; a resolution which authorizes the undertaking to provide continuing disclosure adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the County; and an Award Resolution adopted by the Governing Body of the Issuer on \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_ (collectively the "Resolution") and delivered to \_\_\_\_\_ (the "Purchaser") on the date hereof. Pursuant to the Resolution, the County has covenanted and agreed to provide continuing disclosure of certain financial information and operating data and timely notices of the occurrence of certain events. In addition, the County hereby specifically covenants and agrees as follows:

Section 1. Purpose of the Disclosure Certificate. This Disclosure Certificate is being executed and delivered by the County for the benefit of the beneficial owners of the Securities in order to assist the Participating Underwriters within the meaning of the Rule (defined herein) in complying with SEC Rule 15c2-12(b)(5). This Disclosure Certificate constitutes the written Undertaking required by the Rule.

Section 2. Definitions. In addition to the defined terms set forth in the Resolution, which apply to any capitalized term used in this Disclosure Certificate unless otherwise defined in this Section, the following capitalized terms shall have the following meanings:

"Annual Report" means any annual report provided by the County pursuant to, and as described in, Sections 3 and 4 of this Disclosure Certificate.

"Audited Financial Statements" means the County's annual financial statements, which are currently prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles [GAAP for governmental units as prescribed by GASB] and which the County intends to continue to prepare in substantially the same form.

"Fiscal Year" means the fiscal year of the County.

"Final Official Statement" means the final official statement dated \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_ delivered in connection with the Securities, which is available from the MSRB.

"Governing Body" means the **Board of Commissioners** of the County or such other body as may thereafter be the chief legislative body of the County.

"County" means **County of Washtenaw** which is an obligated person with respect to the Securities.

"County Contact" means the County Administrator, County Finance Director, County Water Resources Commissioner or County Clerk of the County who can be contacted at the **County**.

"Material Event" means any of the events listed in Section 5(a) of this Disclosure Certificate.

"MSRB" means the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board located at 1150 18th Street, N.W., Suite 400, Washington, D.C. 20036.

"NRMSIR" means any nationally recognized municipal securities information repository as recognized from time to time by the SEC for purposes of the Rule.

"Participating Underwriter" means any of the original underwriter(s) of the Securities (including the Purchaser) required to comply with the Rule in connection with the offering of the Securities.

"Repository" means each NRMSIR and each SID, if any.

"Rule" means SEC Rule 15c2-12(b)(5) promulgated by the SEC under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as the same may be amended from time to time.

"SEC" means the Securities and Exchange Commission.

"SID" means any public or private repository or entity designated by the State of Michigan as a state information depository for the purpose of the Rule. The SID shall be the Municipal Advisory Council of Michigan, 1445 First National Building, Detroit, Michigan 48226.

Section 3. Provision of Annual Financial Information and Audited Financial Statements.

(a) The County shall, not later than two hundred seventy (270) days after the end of the Fiscal Year, commencing with the year that ends **December 31, 2009**, provide each Repository with annual financial information which is consistent with the requirements of Section 4 of this Disclosure Certificate. The

annual financial information may be submitted as a single document or as separate documents comprising a package, and may cross-reference other information as provided in Section 4 of this Disclosure Certificate; provided that the Audited Financial Statements of the County may be submitted separately from the balance of the annual financial information; and provided further that unaudited financial statements will be included with the other financial information, if audited statements have not already been furnished.

(b) If the County is unable or fails to provide to the Repositories an Annual Report by the date required in subsection (a), the County shall send a notice of that fact in a timely manner to all NRMSIRs, the MSRB and any SID.

(c) The County shall determine each year prior to the date for providing the Annual Report the name and address of each NRMSIR and each SID, if any.

Section 4. Content of Annual Reports. The County's Annual Report shall contain or incorporate by reference the following information:

Updates of the "State Equalized Valuation", "Taxable Valuation", "Property Tax Levies - Direct and Overlapping Governments", "Property Tax Rates Per \$1,000 Equalized Valuation and Tax Levies", "Statement of Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balances - Governmental Funds", and "Debt Statement (Direct and Overlapping Debt)" contained in the Final Official Statement and the current Audited Financial Statements.

Any or all of the items listed above may be incorporated by reference from other documents, including official statements of debt issues of the County or related public entities, which have been submitted to each of the Repositories or the SEC. If the document incorporated by reference is a final official statement, it must be available from the MSRB. The County shall clearly identify each such other document so incorporated by reference.

Section 5. Reporting of Material Events.

(a) This Section 5 shall govern the giving of notices of the occurrence of any of the following events in a timely manner, if material, with respect to the Securities:

1. Principal and interest payment delinquencies;
2. Non-payment related defaults;
3. Unscheduled draws on debt service reserves reflecting financial difficulties;

4. Unscheduled draws on credit enhancements reflecting financial difficulties;
5. Substitution of credit or liquidity providers, or their failure to perform;
6. Adverse tax opinions or events affecting the tax-exempt status of the Securities;
7. Modification to rights of beneficial owners of the Securities;
8. Securities calls;
9. Defeasances;
10. Release, substitution or sale of property securing repayment of the Securities; and
11. Rating changes.

(b) Whenever a Material Event occurs, the County shall promptly file a notice of such occurrence with either all NRMSIRs or with the MSRB and with any SID. Notwithstanding the foregoing, notice of Material Events described in subsections (a) (8) and (9) need not be given under this subsection any earlier than the notice (if any) of the underlying event is required to be given to beneficial owners of affected Securities pursuant to the Resolution.

(c) Unless otherwise required by law and subject to technical and economic feasibility, the County shall employ such methods of information transmission as shall be requested or recommended by the designated recipients of the County's information.

Section 6. Termination of Reporting Obligation. The County's obligations under the Resolution and this Disclosure Certificate shall terminate upon the legal defeasance, prior redemption or payment in full of all the Securities.

Section 7. County Contact; Agent. Information may be obtained from the County Contact. Additionally, the County may, from time to time, appoint or engage a dissemination agent to assist it in carrying out its obligations under the Resolution and this Disclosure Certificate, and may discharge any such agent, with or without appointing a successor dissemination agent. The initial dissemination agent shall be the Municipal Advisory Council of Michigan, 1445 First National Building, Detroit, Michigan 48226.

Section 8. Amendment; Waiver. Notwithstanding any other provision of the Resolution or this Disclosure Certificate, as provided in this Section 8, any provision of this Disclosure

Certificate may be amended or waived, if such amendment or waiver is supported by an opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel to the effect that such amendment or waiver would not, in and of itself, cause the undertakings to violate the Rule. The provisions of this Disclosure Certificate constituting the Undertaking or any provision hereof, shall be null and void in the event that the County delivers to each then existing NRMSIR and SID, if any, an opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel to the effect that those portions of the Rule which require this Disclosure Certificate are invalid, have been repealed retroactively or otherwise do not apply to the Securities. The provisions of this Disclosure Certificate constituting the Undertaking may be amended without the consent of the beneficial owners of the Securities, but only upon the delivery by the County to each then existing NRMSIR and SID, if any, of the proposed amendment and an opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel to the effect that such amendment, and giving effect thereto, will not adversely affect compliance by the County under this Disclosure Certificate with the Rule. Any such amendment may only be made in connection with a change in circumstances that arises from a change in legal requirements, change in law, or change in the identity, nature, or status of the County or other obligated person (as defined in the Rule) or type of business conducted. No such amendment may be made unless the Undertaking, as amended, would have complied with the requirements of the Rule at the time of the primary offering of the Securities, after taking into account any amendments or interpretations of the Rule, as well as any change in circumstances. No such amendment shall be made unless it does not materially impair the interests of beneficial owners of the Securities, as determined by nationally recognized bond counsel. The annual financial information containing any amended operating data or amended financial information will explain, in narrative form, the reasons for the amendment and the impact of the change in the type of operating data or financial information being provided.

If an amendment is made to the Undertaking specifying the accounting principles to be followed in preparing financial statements, the annual financial information for the year in which the change is made will present a comparison between the financial statements or information prepared on the basis of the new accounting principles and those prepared on the basis of the former accounting principles. The comparison will include a qualitative discussion of the differences in the accounting principles and the impact of the change in the accounting principles on the presentation of the financial information, in order to provide information to investors to enable them to evaluate the ability of the County or any obligated person to meet its obligations. To the extent reasonably feasible, the comparison will also be quantitative. A notice of the change in the accounting principles will be sent to each then existing NRMSIR or the MSRB, and to the SID, if any.

Section 9. Additional Information. Nothing in this Disclosure Certificate shall be deemed to prevent the County from disseminating any other information, using the means of dissemination set forth in this Disclosure Certificate or any other means of communication, or including any other information in any Annual Report or notice of occurrence of a Material Event, in addition to that which is required by this Disclosure Certificate. If the County chooses to include any information in any Annual Report or notice of occurrence of a Material Event in addition to that which is specifically required by this Disclosure Certificate, the County shall have no obligation under this Disclosure Certificate to update such information or include it in any future Annual Report or notice of occurrence of a Material Event.

Section 10. Default. In the event of a failure of the County to comply with any provision of this Disclosure Certificate any holder of the Securities may take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate, including seeking mandamus or specific performance by court order, to cause the County to comply with its obligations under the Resolution and this Disclosure Certificate. A default under this Disclosure Certificate shall not be deemed an event of default with respect to the Securities and the sole remedy under this Disclosure Certificate in the event of any failure of the County to comply with this Disclosure Certificate shall be an action to compel performance.

Section 11. Beneficiaries. This Disclosure Certificate shall inure solely to the benefit of the County, the Participating Underwriters and beneficial owners from time to time of the Securities, and shall create no rights in any other person or entity.

A RESOLUTION TO OPPOSE SJR H

WASHTENAW COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

MAY 6, 2009

WHEREAS, the Michigan Senate approved SJR H, which would amend the Michigan Constitution to require the taxable value of property to remain the same if that property's value declined, even if the property's assessed value remained higher than its taxable value; and

WHEREAS, the Senate Fiscal Agency report dated March 12, 2009, warned that "The proposed constitutional amendment would reduce both State and local property taxes by approximately \$253.0 million in the first year the amendment was in effect"; and

WHEREAS, SJR H would have a devastating effect on every unit of local government, every public school system, and every County in the State of Michigan, and would require dramatic cuts in public safety and justice, roads, parks, and other services; and

WHEREAS, SJR H would also have a devastating effect on the State budget because, according to the Senate Fiscal Agency's report, the State would be forced to increase funding for the School Aid Fund to compensate for the lost property tax revenue, resulting in further cuts in State funding for other vital state services; and

WHEREAS, SJR H is unnecessary because Proposal A already protects property owners from large increases in their property taxes by limiting annual increases in property's taxable value to 5% or the rate of inflation, whichever is less; and

WHEREAS, empirical studies show that businesses and individuals consider quality of life a higher priority than tax rates when considering to maintain operations or residency in Michigan, and SJR H would therefore hinder our ability to attract and retain businesses and highly skilled workers by reducing funding for basic public services,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners opposes SJR H, and urges our State Representatives from Washtenaw County, Representatives Kathy Angerer, Pam Byrnes, Rebekah Warren and Alma Wheeler Smith to oppose the House version of SJR H, and to urge their colleagues in the House to also oppose the bill; and

THEREFORE IT BE ALSO RESOLVED that the County Clerk send a copy of this resolution to Gov. Jennifer Granholm, Lt. Gov. John Cherry, State Senator Liz Brater, and to other counties for their consideration.

WHEREAS, The State of Michigan Department of Human Services was sued by Children's Rights regarding the care of children in foster care; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Human Services settled the case out-of-court without consent or consultation from Michigan's counties; and

WHEREAS, Michigan counties are the funding source for one-half of the costs of foster care and juvenile justice services in the State of Michigan; and

WHEREAS, The cost of settlement agreement between the Department of Human Services and Children's Rights would require Michigan's counties to pay, without their consent, up to \$32,000,000 per year statewide in *calculable costs*, with additional county costs evident that are not able to be calculated; and

WHEREAS, Michigan's counties face staggering cuts to services across the board due to declining property tax base, state funding cuts to support mandated services, increasing responsibilities eliminated from the state government being forced to counties, and increasing state regulation; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners urges the legislature and the Governor to hold counties harmless from the increased County Child Care Fund expenses associated with the agreement reached between the Department of Human Services and Children's Rights; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be distributed to the Governor, Senators Richardville and Brater, Representatives Byrnes, Warren, Smith and Angerer, and the Michigan Association of Counties for their consideration and action.
