He stated that another sub group is putting together a packet for the legislature. VanDerworp reported that another group is working on Willow Run marketing. Comm. Sizemore added that work is being done to get an additional two hangers.

Comm. Peterson asked if the bylaws prohibit appointment of Bob Guenzel by the Chair of the Board even if he is not County Administrator. He added that a great opportunity for partnership now exists. Comm. Peterson added that it is crucial to have the support of the legislative delegation. He stated that consistency is needed in the project.

Report on contracts in the amount of \$25,000 and under from March 1, 2010 to March 31, 2010

Comm. Smith seconded by Comm. Irwin moved to set a public hearing at a regular Board of Commissioners meeting on May 19, 2010 at 6:45 p.m. in the Board Room, Administration Building, 220 N. Main Street in Ann Arbor, Michigan for consideration of expanding the Road Commission from three to five members.

Comm. Prater stated that he will oppose this motion because it adds a cost to the Road Commission if completed. He added that the relationship between the management and unions is much better than it has been.

Comm. Judge stated that the Road Commission should be expanded to five but added that she is concerned about the timing. Comm. Judge stated that the Road Commission staff has been excellent.

Comm. Gunn stated that she will support this resolution because the information being discussed needs to be heard. She stated that this hearing would be doing a service by listening.

Comm. Irwin stated that he also agrees that the Road Commission needs to be expanded. He added that a public hearing should be set to get the process moving.

Comm. Ping stated that she will not support this right now due to the current financial condition of the Road Commission. She added that the Road Commission has been wonderful.

Comm. Schwartz seconded by Comm. Prater moved to table this motion until the regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners on May 19th. Roll call vote: YEAS: 11 NAYS: 0 ABSENT: 0. Motion carried.

Eric Sturgis, 6655 Jackson Rd., stated that he would like to thank Comm. Smith for introducing the resolution. He added that he feels there should be a public hearing and stated that he sees no harm in one.

WHEREAS, Earl and Diane Horning, along with their son, Jeff, and his wife, Lynda, are progressive dairy producers who actively engage in industry leadership and hands-on committee roles at the local, state and national levels; and

WHEREAS, It's this family's commitment to the Michigan dairy industry that earned them the distinction of being awarded the Michigan State University Dairy Farmer of the Year, the highest honor bestowed from the MSU Department of Animal Science; and

WHEREAS, The Horning family of Manchester works together to operate the six-generation family dairy operation started in 1877. Today, their farm consists of 360 milk cows, 410 head of young stock and 700 acres of cropland. The rolling herd average is 27,476 pounds of milk; and

WHEREAS, the Hornings focus on helping consumers learn about the dairy industry, actively serving on the Michigan Milk Producers Association (MMPA) Board of Directors, the Michigan Farm Bureau promotion and education programs, and other state and national dairy promotional boards; and

WHEREAS, they have been involved in an effort spearheaded by the United Dairy Industry of Michigan (UDIM) to develop a news bureau to educate consumers unfamiliar with farm life. They have opened their farm to video crews and photographers as a modern-day example of dairy farming, and will host a regional Breakfast on the Farm event community members and local leaders; and

WHEREAS, in addition to their promotion work, the Hornings – all MSU graduates – have partnered with MSU and MSU Extension on a number of research and education projects and served as case study examples for dairy farm management courses.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners hereby recognize the Horning family for their commitment and contributions to the dairy industry and congratulate them on being named the 2010 MSU Dairy Farmer of the Year.

April 21, 2010

WHEREAS, the week of April 5 – 11, 2010 is National Public Health Week and the theme is "A Healthier America; One Community at a Time"; and

WHEREAS, the United States spends more on health care than any other country, but an estimated 46,300,000 people in the United States do not have health insurance and millions more do not have access to life-saving clinical preventive services; and

WHEREAS, many of the illnesses that are caused by tobacco use, poor diet, physical inactivity, and alcohol consumption are potentially preventable; and

WHEREAS, many neighborhoods lack access to safe walkways and bikeways, are too far to walk from offices, schools, health providers, and grocery stores, and are inaccessible by public transportation; and

WHEREAS, studies have shown that 10,500,000 cases of infectious diseases and 33,000 deaths can be prevented in the United States by using the standard childhood immunizations series; and

WHEREAS, the county health rankings report released by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation in February 2010 ranked Washtenaw County best in the state in health factors and seventh in health outcomes. These factors and outcomes include: health behavior, clinical care, social and economic factors, physical environment, morbidity, and mortality that impact residents' health;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners do hereby proclaim the week of April 5-11, 2010 as Public Health Week "A Healthier America; One Community at a Time";

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners expresses its appreciation for the ongoing contributions of County staff, individuals, and organizations who make up our public health system and carry out this important work.

WHEREAS, ETCS is required to submit an application to the Michigan Department of Energy, Labor, and Economic Growth (MDELEG) for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2009 Employment Services (ES) program plan, in the amount of \$498,065, for the period of July 1 2009 through June 30, 2010; and

WHEREAS, ETCS will administer the Employment Services (ES) program through its Career Transition Center, enabling workers to acquire the skills necessary to succeed in today's 21st Century knowledge economy; and

WHEREAS, the Employment Services (ES) program will offer job seekers a variety of employment-related labor exchange services including job search assistance, assessment, job referral, and placement of job seekers; re-employment services to unemployment insurance claimants; and recruitment services to employers; and

WHEREAS, ETCS will serve employers and job seekers under State direction, through grants to local Michigan Works! Agencies (MWA); and

WHEREAS, The federal Wagner-Peyser Act of 1933 provided for the establishment of a nationwide labor exchange system, known as the Employment Services (ES), and was amended by the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) of 1988 to make the ES program part of the One-Stop services delivery system; and

WHEREAS, this matter has been reviewed by the Washtenaw County Workforce Development Board (WDB), Corporation Counsel, the Finance Department, Human Resources, the County Administrator's Office and the Ways & Means Committee.
