Administration

Capital Area Transportation Authority – Feasibility Study of a Lansing-Detroit Passenger Rail System

Richard Shackson and Michael Benham provided the Board with a summary of the Lansing to Detroit Passenger Rail Study and asked for input from Board Members regarding (1) Station Location, (2) Local Funding Options, and (3) Organizational Structure. Time was allowed for discussion.

Central Dispatch – Creating a Central Dispatch Authority

Comm. Bergman supported by Comm. DuRussel moved to recommend that the Board of Commissioners approve the resolution, at the Board Meeting tonight, approving an Urban Co-Operation Act Agreement with the State of Michigan to create a separate legal entity to be known as the Washtenaw Central Dispatch and Technology Authority.

Craig Swensen, Central Dispatch Authority, answered questions.

Employment Training and Community Services - Transportation to Work Program

Comm. Bergman supported by Comm. DuRussel moved to recommend that the Board of Commissioners approve the resolution ratifying the signature of the Chair of the Board on the Transportation-to-Work Program Plan to the Michigan Department of Career Development for the Employment Training and Community Services Group in the amount of \$201,701 for the period of April 1, 2000, through December 31, 2000; authorizing the Administrator to sign the Notice of Grant Award; approving the budget; and authorizing the County Administrator to sign delegate contracts.

Trenda Rusher, ETCS Director, answered questions.

Planning – Establishing a Washtenaw County HOME Consortium

Comm. Bergman supported by Comm. DuRussel moved to recommend that the Board of Commissioners approve the resolution authorizing the Administrator to sign a Cooperative Agreement and submit application materials to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the purpose of establishing a Home Consortium in Washtenaw County for the period of October 1, 2000, through December 31, 2003.

Mark Roby, Planning, answered questions. A friendly amendment was accepted in the second paragraph of the resolution to clarify that the allocation is from the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Sheriff – Racial Profiling Project

Comm. Bergman supported by Comm. DuRussel moved to recommend that the Board of Commissioners approve the resolution requesting the Board of Commissioners to authorize funding in the amount of \$30,000 for a Data Collection and Analysis Project to address allegations of racial profiling in Washtenaw County.

Sheriff Ron Schebil and Commander Jerry Clayton answered questions.

Sheriff – Creating & Eliminating Positions for the COPS MORE 98 Grant Program

Comm. Bergman supported by Comm. DuRussel moved to recommend that the Board of Commissioners approve the resolution creating and eliminating positions for the Cops More 98 Grant Award.

Sheriff Ron Schebil and Commander Chaffee answered questions.
