Community Support & Treatment Services (CSTS) is the agency contracted by the Washtenaw Community Health Organization (WCHO) to provide Specialty Services to the severely and persistently mentally ill as well as Adults with Developmental Disabilities, and children with Severe Emotional Disturbances or Developmental Disabilities.

Services are available to eligible persons regardless of age, sex, race, ethnicity, sexual preference, marital status, religion, physical or mental handicaps, and/or ability to pay. CSTS serves visually impaired, hearing impaired and sites are wheelchair accessible.

Funds to provide the services are received from governmental appropriations, Michigan's Department of Community Health, the United Way, donations, special grants and fees for services provided.

SERVICES TO PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

"DD Services" has a lot to offer to a community member with a developmental disability. There are in– and out– of home respite programs when you'd like to take a break from the every day pressures. There are school and community transition programs to assist you as you move through the phases of life. There are also options for entitlement advocacy (fight for your rights!), resource planning (find what you need when you need it and vocational services including job and daily living skills, and job coaching.

SERVICES FOR ADULTS WITH MENTAL ILLNESS

"MI Services" are for adults diagnosed with a severe and persistent mental illness. We use continuous support teams to help you with recovery-focused treatment. The goal is to live a life of the highest potential. We meet you at your need whether its for counseling services, medications, or both. We also have programs available for community members dealing with mental illness and substance use (drugs or alcohol) at the same time. A great number of options to assist you are available.

YOUTH & FAMILY SERVICES

"YF Services" offers almost all of the services offered by DD Services and MI Services but with a special focus on children (newborn to 18 years of age), their parents/guardians, and families. We work with the family as a whole to figure out what the best treatment plan will be. Appointments are available in Ypsilanti at the Huron Valley Child Guidance Clinic, as well as in Chelsea, Manchester, and Whitmore Lake.



MICHIGAN PREVENTS PRODROMAL PROGRAGRESSION (M3P)

Not MP3, but M3P! This program does special services for young people between the ages of 12-15 to stop mental illness before it starts. There are assessments (tests) for early detection and services available along with community education opportunities to learn more about what mental illness is and isn't.

COMMUNITY CRISIS RESPONSE TEAM (CCRT)

CCRT responds to mental health emergencies out in the community using local agency partners and natural supports (your family and friends) for anyone in crisis even if you aren't already receiving our services.
