What is the Medical Reserve Corps?

The Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) brings together local health professionals and others with health-related skills to assist local, existing community emergency medical response systems.



Volunteers:

- Participate in local drills and exercises such as mass prophylaxis, vaccination clinics and other emergency preparedness scenarios.
- Are ready to assist during an emergency.
- Must be at least 18 years old with a valid Michigan photo I.D. Current licensure and U.S. citizenship are not required.
- *Participation is always voluntary*
