SECTION 5 COLLECTIONS

Collection will include a written summary of project highlights (e.g. source of items, when items were added to collection, why they are of personal interest, what you have learned by collecting, etc.). To be shown in successive years you must show that additions were made to the collection since it was last shown. Collections should remain at the Youth Show unless value or size of collection makes this impossible. Plan to leave a part of the collection or a photograph if you cannot leave your entire collection.

Learning Objective: To encourage youth to develop and enhance their skills in creating and marketing a product. **Rules:**

- Members must register for the Entrepreneurship Project on the Youth Show pre-registration form due June 27th or June 28th, 2013.
- 2. Each 4-H member age 9 to 18 may show one (1) inanimate project in this class with the exception of perishable items. Perishable items include all food items, fresh vegetables and fruits and fresh flowers, etc.
- 3. Items submitted in the entrepreneurship project may not be exhibited in any other class, i.e. An exhibitor may exhibit jewelry in the jewelry class and exhibit a piece of jewelry in the entrepreneurship class also; however, they may not use the same item under two different classes—they will need to make two items, one for each class.
- 4. A project sheet (available on-line or at the 4H office) and index card must be filled out and accompany the project at the time of judging. The project sheet explains how the project was made, the cost, time spent on the project, and lessons learned while making the project. Members must write a 2 or 3 sentence marketing description of the project on an index card to accompany the project at judging and on display.

Silent Auction in conjunction with the Entrepreneurship Project

- 1. Members will/must have their Entrepreneurship Project exhibited in a specific area of Building "A" after judging on Monday. (Designated area to be announced closer to fair.)
- 2. Project will remain on exhibit in that specific area throughout the week along with their report.
- 3. Members will set a minimum price that they will accept for their project and that minimum amount will be posted on their Silent Auction form which will accompany the project on display.
- 4. Bids may be entered until the close of the 4-H day on Thursday, August 1 at 9:00 p.m.
- 5. Bidders will be notified if they are the final bidder by Noon on Friday, August 2.
- 6. Bidders must remit payment for the purchased project between Noon and 7 p.m. on Friday, August 2.
- 7. Projects may be removed by the bidder after payment is made in full and after 8 p.m. on Friday night August 2.
- 8. If the Entrepreneurship Project does not receive a minimum bid or if the buyer has not paid in full by 7 p.m. on Friday, August 2, the project will be moved to the member's club booth to pick up on Saturday morning, August 3.
