At a minimum, the WHEP Homebuyer Education Program consists of an Orientation class, two Pre-Purchase Education classes, and a one-on-one Credit Review appointment. There may be additional classes required depending on financial and credit readiness. All WHEP classes are open to the public; however you must register at least 1 day before the course. **Classes are limited to 45 participants so please register early and also note we cannot accommodate children.**

In the WHEP Homebuyer Education Program you will receive education regarding a number of topics including:

- Homebuyer readiness
- Credit Reports and Repair
- Getting a Mortgage Loan
- Working with Realtors and Lenders
- Accessing Down-Payment Assistance
- Property Taxes and Insurance
- Foreclosure Prevention
- And much more!

While WHEP Homebuyer Education is open to anyone, in order to qualify for any kind of financial assistance, a family must fall at or below the program income guidelines. The attached Program Income Limit Chart for Washtenaw County (FY 2007/2008) on **page 2** of this package indicates household income limits for each assistance program for which WHEP provides educational and counseling services.

As county, state and federal dollars fund the WHEP services, income verification will be required for the entire household. This verification will be completed during your participation in the WHEP Homebuyer Education classes. You do NOT need to bring any income documentation with you to the first class—we will go over the information we need from you in order to verify your household income during the Orientation class. However, **all adult household members MUST attend ALL classes in order to be eligible for assistance.**

How Long Does the WHEP Program Take?

The WHEP Homebuyer Education Program timeframe can be very different from one household to another. For some households, one month is sufficient to move through the education, receive their release to purchase, begin applying for assistance and make an offer on a home.

However, for most households, the process takes *a minimum of three to six months*—and for some it can take years. Our goal is to make sure you are prepared for homeownership BEFORE you purchase—no matter how long it takes.

Below you will find the class schedules for 2008. All programs (with the exception of Sessions #2 and #8) are located at the Washtenaw County LLRC—see page 4 of this package for a map.

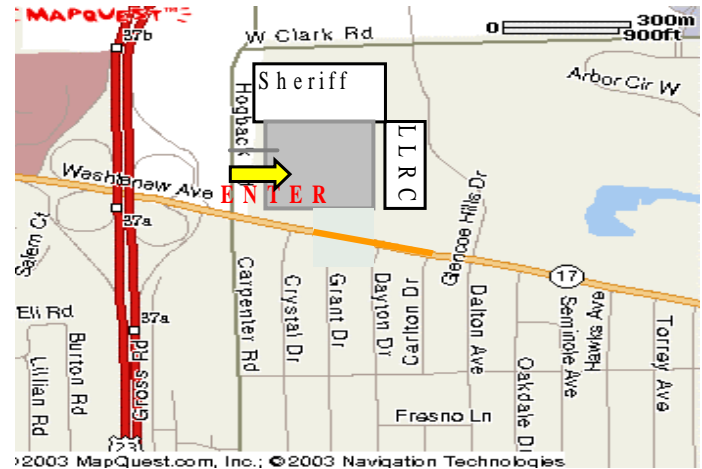

Washtenaw County Western County Service Center (MSUE Classroom):

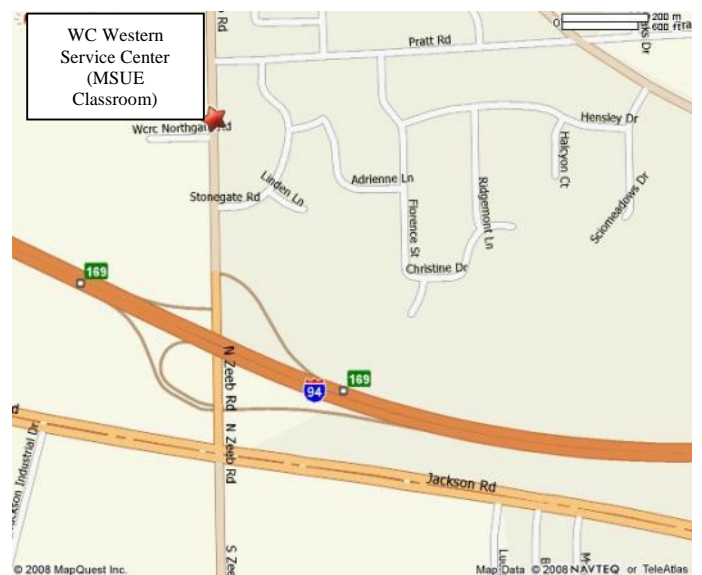
Washtenaw County Library Learning Resource Center (LLRC)

- From US-23 take Exit 37a (Ypsilanti) onto Washtenaw Avenue (East).
- At first intersection turn left (North) on Hogback.
- Turn right into the Washtenaw County Service Center just past the corner.

- From I-94 take Exit 169 Zeeb Road.
- If coming from the West, turn left (North) onto Zeeb Rd. If coming from the East, turn right (North) onto Zeeb Rd.
- Turn left into the Washtenaw County Western Service Center (third county building on right). The MSUE Classroom is downstairs.
