I. PROPOSAL
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<b>Definitions:</b>	<b>“County”</b>	Washtenaw County in Michigan.
	<b>“Bidder”</b>	An individual or business submitting a bid to Washtenaw County.
	<b>“Contractor”</b>	One who contracts to perform work or furnish materials in accordance with a contract.
	<b>“WCPARC”</b>	Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation Commission

**Purpose of Proposal:** Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation Commission has seven (7) County Parks facilities needing 150 deciduous trees provided, planted and maintained.

## Proposal Terms:

A. Washtenaw County reserves the right to reject any and all proposals received as a result of this RFP. If a proposal is selected it will be the most advantageous regarding price, quality of service, the Contractor's qualifications and capabilities to provide the specified service, and other factors which Washtenaw County may consider. The County does not intend to award a contract fully on the basis of any response made to the proposal; the County reserves the right to consider proposals for modifications at any time before a contract would be awarded, and negotiations would be undertaken with that contractor whose proposal is deemed to best meet the County's specifications and needs.

B. Proposals must be signed by an official authorized to bind the Contractor to its provisions for at least a period of 60 days. Failure of the successful bidder to accept the obligation of the contract may result in the cancellation of any award.

C. In the event it becomes necessary to revise any part of the RFP, addenda will be provided. Deadlines for submission of RFP's may be adjusted to allow for revisions. Submit the entire proposal document with any amendments at the same time. To be considered, **original proposal and four (4) copies (5 total)** must be at the County Purchasing Office on or before the date and time specified.

D. Proposals should be prepared simply and economically providing a straight-forward, concise description of the contractor's ability to meet the requirements of the RFP. Proposals shall be written in ink or typewritten. No erasures are permitted. Mistakes may be crossed out and corrected and must be initialed in ink by the person **signing** the proposal.

E. The County reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive or not waive informalities or irregularities in bids or bidding procedures, and to accept or further negotiate cost, terms, or conditions of any bid determined by the County to be in the best interests of the County even though not the lowest bid.

## II. PROPOSAL SPECIFICATIONS

The proposal MUST include all the following information:

- A. Contractor's Qualifications, years in business, experience in providing the level and type of service specified in the proposal.
- B. Bank references with name and phone number of contact person.
- C. At least three (3) current references of companies covering similar services listed in the proposal. Include company name, contact name and phone number.

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## III. STANDARD PROVISIONS FOR CONTRACTS

If a contract is awarded, the selected vendor will be required to adhere to a set of general contract provisions that will become a part of any formal agreement. These provisions are general principles that apply to all contractors of service to Washtenaw County such as the following:

### ARTICLE III - REPORTING OF CONTRACTOR

Section 1 - The Contractor is to report to the Department of Facilities Management and will cooperate and confer with him/her as necessary to insure satisfactory work progress.

Section 2 - All reports, estimates, memoranda and documents submitted by the Contractor must be dated and bear the Contractor's name.

Section 3 - All reports made in connection with these services are subject to review and final approval by the County Administrator.

Section 4 - The County may review and inspect the Contractor's activities during the term of this contract.

Section 5 - When applicable the Contractor shall submit a final, written report to the County Administrator.

Section 6 - After reasonable notice to the Contractor, the County may review any of the Contractor's internal records, reports, or insurance policies.

### ARTICLE V - PERSONNEL

Section 1 - The Contractor will provide the required services personally and will not subcontract or assign the services without the County's written approval.

Section 2 - The Contractor will not hire any County employee for any of the required services without the County's written approval.

Section 3 - The parties agree that the Contractor is neither an employee nor an agent of the County for any purpose.

## ARTICLE VI - INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT

The Contractor will protect, defend and indemnify Washtenaw County, its officers, agents, servants, volunteers and employees from any and all liabilities, claims, liens, fines, demands and costs, including legal fees, of whatsoever kind and nature which may result in injury or death to any persons, including the Contractor's own employees, and for loss or damage to any property, including property owned or in the care, custody or control of Washtenaw County in connection with or in any way incident to or arising out of the occupancy, use, service, operations, performance or non-performance of work in connection with this contract resulting in whole or in part from negligent acts or omissions of Contractor, any sub-contractor, or any employee, agent or representative of the Contractor or any subcontractor.

## ARTICLE VII - INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

The Contractor will maintain at its expense during the term of this Contract, the following insurance:

1. Worker's Compensation Insurance with Michigan statutory limits and Employer's Liability Insurance with a minimum limit of \$100,000 each accident for any employees.
2. Comprehensive General Liability Insurance with a combined single limit of \$1,000,000 each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. The County shall be added as an "additional insured" on General Liability policy with respect to the services provided under this contract.
3. Automobile Liability Insurance covering all owned, hired, and non-owned vehicles with Personal Protection Insurance and Property Protection Insurance to comply with the provisions of Michigan No-Fault Insurance Law, including residual liability insurance with a minimum combined single limit of \$1,000,000 each accident for bodily injury and property damage.

Insurance companies, named insurers and policy forms shall be subject to the approval of the Washtenaw County Administrator. Such approval shall not contain endorsements of policy conditions which reduce coverage provided to Washtenaw County or insurance companies insuring Washtenaw County for all costs resulting from both financially unsound insurance companies selected by Contractor and their inadequate insurance coverage. Contractor shall furnish the Washtenaw County Administrator with satisfactory certificates of insurance or a certified copy of the policy, if requested by the County Administrator.

No payments will be made to the Contractor until the certificates of insurance have been received and approved by the Administrator. If the insurance as evidenced by certificates furnished by the Contractor, expires or is canceled during the term of the contract, services and related payments will be suspended. Contractor shall furnish the County Administrator's Office with certification of insurance evidencing such coverage's and endorsements at least ten (10) working days prior to commencement of services under this Contract. Certificates of insurance shall be addressed to the County Administrator's Office, PO Box 8645, Ann Arbor, MI 48107 and shall provide for 30 day written notice to the certificate holder of cancellation of coverage.

## **ARTICLE VIII - COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS**

The contractor will comply with all federal, state and local regulations, including, but not limited to, all applicable OSHA/MIOSHA requirements and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

## **ARTICLE IX - INTEREST OF CONTRACTOR AND COUNTY**

The Contractor promises that it has no interest which would conflict with the performance of services required by this contract. The Contractor also promises that, in the performance of this contract, no officer, agency, employee of the County of Washtenaw, or member of its governing bodies, may participate in any decision relating to this contract which affects his/her personal interest or interest of any corporation, partnership or association in which he/she is directly or indirectly interested, or has any personal or pecuniary interest. However, this paragraph does not apply if there has been compliance with the provisions of Section 3 of Act No. 317 of the Public Acts of 1968 and/or Section 30 of Act No. 156 of the Public Acts of 1851, as amended by Act No. 51 of the Public Acts of 1978, whichever is applicable.

## **ARTICLE X - CONTINGENT FEES**

The Contractor promises that it has not employed or retained any company or person, other than bona fide employees working solely for the Contractor, to solicit or secure this contract, and that it has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, other than bona fide employees working solely for the Contractor, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gifts or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this contract. For breach of this promise, the County may cancel this contract without liability or, at its discretion, deduct the full amount of the fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift or contingent fee from the compensation due the Contractor.

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## **ARTICLE XI - EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY**

The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, physical handicap, age, height, weight, marital status, veteran status, religion or political belief (except as it relates to a bona fide occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of the business).

The Contractor agrees to post notices containing this policy against discrimination in conspicuous places available to applicants for employment and employees. All solicitations or advertisements for employees, placed by or on behalf of the Contractor, shall state that all qualified applicants shall receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, creed, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, physical handicap, age, height, weight, marital status, veteran status, religion or political belief.

## **ARTICLE XII - EQUAL ACCESS**

The Contractor shall provide the services set forth in Article I without discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, marital status, physical handicap or age.

## **ARTICLE XIII - OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS AND PUBLICATION**

All documents developed as a result of this contract will be freely available to the public. None may be copyrighted by the Contractor. During the performance of the services, the Contractor will be responsible for any loss of or damage to the documents while they are its possession and must restore the loss or damage at its expense. Any use of the information and results of this contract by the Contractor must reference the project sponsorship by the County. Any publication of the information or results must be co-authored by the County.

## **ARTICLE XIV - ASSIGNS & SUCCESSORS**

This contract is binding on the County and the Contractor, their successors and assigns. Neither the County nor the Contractor will assign or transfer its interest in this Contract without the written consent of the other.

## **ARTICLE XV - TERMINATION OF CONTRACT**

Section 1 - Termination without cause. Either party may terminate the contract by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the other party.

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## ARTICLE XVI - PAYROLL TAXES

The Contractor is responsive for all applicable state and federal social security benefits and unemployment taxes and agrees to indemnify and protect the County against such liability.

## ARTICLE XVII - PRACTICE AND ETHICS

The parties will conform to the code of ethics of their respective national professional associations.

## ARTICLE XVIII – PREVAILING WAGE RATES

The Contractor agrees that all craftsmen, mechanics and laborers it employs to work on this project shall, at a minimum, receive the prevailing wages and fringe benefits of the Building Trade Department for corresponding classes of craftsmen, mechanics and laborers for the Washtenaw County area, as determined and published by the Davis-Bacon Division of the United States Department of Labor. Contractor agrees that all subcontracts entered into by the Contractor shall contain a similar provision covering any sub-contractor's employees who perform work on this project.

## ARTICLE XIX - CHANGES IN SCOPE OR SCHEDULE OF SERVICES

Changes mutually agreed upon by the County and the Contractor, will be incorporated into this contract by written amendments signed by both parties.

## ARTICLE XX - CHOICE OF LAW AND FORUMS

This contract is to be interpreted by the laws of Michigan. The parties agree that the proper forum for litigation arising out of this contract is Washtenaw County, Michigan.

## ARTICLE XXI - EXTENT OF CONTRACT

This contract represents the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior representations, negotiations or agreements whether written or oral.

## IV. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

**Award:** Washtenaw County reserves the right to reject any and all proposals received as a result of this RFP. If a proposal is selected it will be the most advantageous regarding price (See "Low Bid" following), quality of service, the Contractors' qualifications and capabilities to provide the specified service, and other factors which the County may consider. The County does not intend to award a contract fully on the basis of any response made to the proposal; the County reserves the right to consider proposals for modifications at any time before a contract would be awarded, and negotiations would be undertaken with that contractor whose proposal is deemed to best meet the County's specifications and needs. The County does intend to award the entire contract to a single contractor

**Low Bid:** Low Bid will be determined by response given on the Bid Sheet to the lowest bidder/bidders with the qualifications, work experience and capabilities required in the proposal

**Term of Contract:** The term of the contract will be for one (1) year with an option to extend for an additional amount of time. The same terms and conditions would apply if the County and Contractor agree.

## GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

- 1.) Washtenaw County Parks & Recreation Commission will conduct a pre bid meeting giving each individual or company the opportunity to ask questions related to the sites of the proposed work in order to fully acquaint themselves with existing conditions so that they may fully understand any difficulties and restriction involving the execution of the work under the proposed contract. The failure or omission to receive and examine any documents, addendum or other information, or not to attend the pre bid meeting and acquaint oneself with conditions existing there shall in no way relieve any individual or organization from any obligation with respect to the proposal or to the contract. The submission of a proposal shall be taken as prima facie evidence of compliance with this section.
- 2.) The Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation Commission (WCPARC) has been awarded a grant from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, Urban and Community Forestry Program to replace ash trees killed by the Emerald Ash Borer. The grant will pay approximately 40% of the cost of planting 150 native deciduous trees at seven (7) WCPARC facilities in Washtenaw County. The County will pay the remaining portion of the costs.
- 3.) Tree planting should occur between April 1, 2006 and May 15, 2006 (weather and site conditions permitting). If planting is delayed special measures must be employed to ensure plant establishment.

# RFP #6262 ASH TREE REPLACEMENT SERVICES

## SCOPE OF WORK

Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation Commission proposes to contract tree replacement services for Seven (7) sites (See Appendix B). All labor, materials and equipment necessary to perform the work required for the supplying, planting and maintenance of the trees shall be provided by the successful bidder.

- 1.) **Tree Species** – Five (5) species of trees will be required for planting: Red Oak, Bur Oak, Basswood, Tuliptree and Red Maple. The number of trees to be planted at each facility is shown in the chart Emerald Ash Borer Tree Planting (See Appendix D). The trees shall be 1.5” – 2.0” caliper in size and shall be balled and burlapped (B&B). Trees must be approved by the County prior to delivery to their respective sites (for accuracy of species, good form and overall condition). The Contractor will notify the County when the trees are ready to be inspected for approval.
- 2.) **Tree Planting** – In general the trees are to be planted in readily accessible locations along roads and in parking lots where a light vehicle and power equipment can be used. Trees must be planted as shown on DNR tree planting detail IC-4108 (See Appendix C). A minimum of 2” -3” of untreated mulch will be required around each tree. Staking will be required only in heavy clay soil and/or on windy, exposed sites as directed by the County.
- 3.) **Tree Planting Locations** – The Contractor will notify WCPARC of impending plantings two (2) weeks in advance so planting locations can be staked. Tree planting locations in the field will be staked by the County approximately one week prior to planting. The Contractor must contact Miss Dig prior to the planting of trees and will be responsible for any damage to utilities and park property during tree installations. Preliminary planting location maps will be available for inspection at the pre-bid meeting on Friday February 17, 2006 at 3:00pm at the Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation Commission Administrative Offices, 2230 Platt Road, Ann Arbor, MI.
- 4.) **Tree Maintenance** – The Contractor will be required to maintain the trees for a one (1) year period after planting. The Contractor must follow the DNR Tree Maintenance Guidelines IC4108-1 (see Appendix A). Watering will be required to keep the root zone moist during the first growing season. Trees that die within the first year after planting must be replaced by the Contractor. Ten (10%) percent of the contract amount will be held back until one (1) year past the planting of the last trees and/or the planting of replacement trees. The County will begin maintaining the trees the second full year after planting (2007) and beyond.

## APPENDIX A

### Tree Maintenance Guidelines (Minimum)

*This information is provide by Authority of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources*

To ensure success from your tree planting, the tree must be properly cared for after the initial planting. A properly maintained tree grows well, has less problems and provides many benefits to people and our environment. By following the three year maintenance guidelines, trees receive the care they need to become established. After the first three years, trees should be routinely inspected for problems and watered during dry spells.

#### **Your tree should be planted according to the specifications in these planting guides...**

- American National Standards Institute (ANSI)
- Tree City USA Bulletin No. 19 - How to Select and Plant a Tree
- DNR Tree Planting Guide (IC 4108)

#### **The year after the tree is planted these specifications should be followed...**

- **Water.** Check soil moisture a few inches below the surface in the root ball.
- **Mulch.** Layer 3 to 4 inches above the ground around the tree but not touching the tree trunk. The area should be four times the area of the root ball. Do not use treated or dyed mulch.
- **Prune** only if necessary. Follow specifications in the How to Prune Trees bulletin (NA-FR-01-95) and/or Tree City USA Bulletin No. 1 - How to Prune Young Shade Trees.
- **Stake** only if necessary. Follow the specifications on the Tree Planting Guide (IC 4108).
- **Check** for mower/weed whip damage, vandal damage and animal damage.
- **Check** for any insect or disease problems on the tree and surrounding trees. Contact a forester or arborist if a problem exists.
- **Do not** fertilize. Fertilizer applied to newly transplanted trees can excessively dry roots (burning).
- **Remove** all tags and twine from the tree to prevent girdling

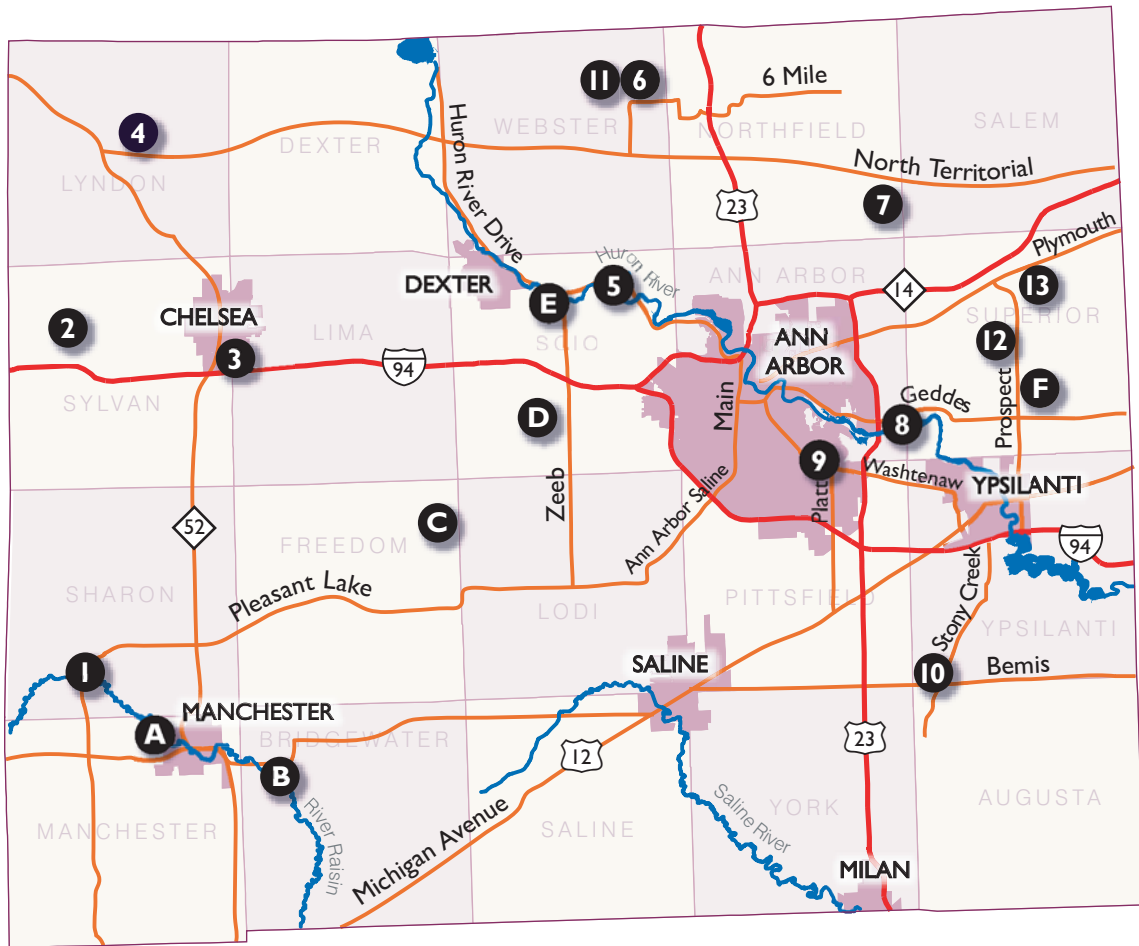
#### **The second year after the tree is planted...**

- **Water.** Trees should be checked and watered. Monitor and water trees from spring to fall.
- **Mulch.** The area surrounding the tree must be re-mulched every spring to achieve the 3-4 inches depth.
- **Remove** any stakes and ties.
- **Prune** only if necessary. Follow specifications in the How to Prune Trees bulletin (NA-FR-01-95).
- **Check** for any insect or disease problems on the new trees and surrounding trees. Contact a forester or arborist if a problem exists.

#### **The third year after the tree is planted...**

- **Water.** Root systems are still being established and soil moisture needs to be checked on a regular basis from early spring to fall.
- **Re-mulch** trees in the spring.
- **Prune** if necessary. Remember to prune before the growing season starts.
- **Check** for any type of damage and make corrections.
- Trees may be **fertilized** in the spring if a need exists. Consult a forester or arborist before fertilizing.

Research has shown that it takes approximately three years for a transplanted tree to become well established on a new site. Maintaining a vigorous, healthy tree requires commitment well after the initial planting. The tree should have a healthy living environment and a structurally good form. Good form is obtained from quality planting stock, and importantly, from proper pruning. Your tree should be mulched, watered, free of insect and disease problems and should be protected from animal damage and lawn care equipment injury.



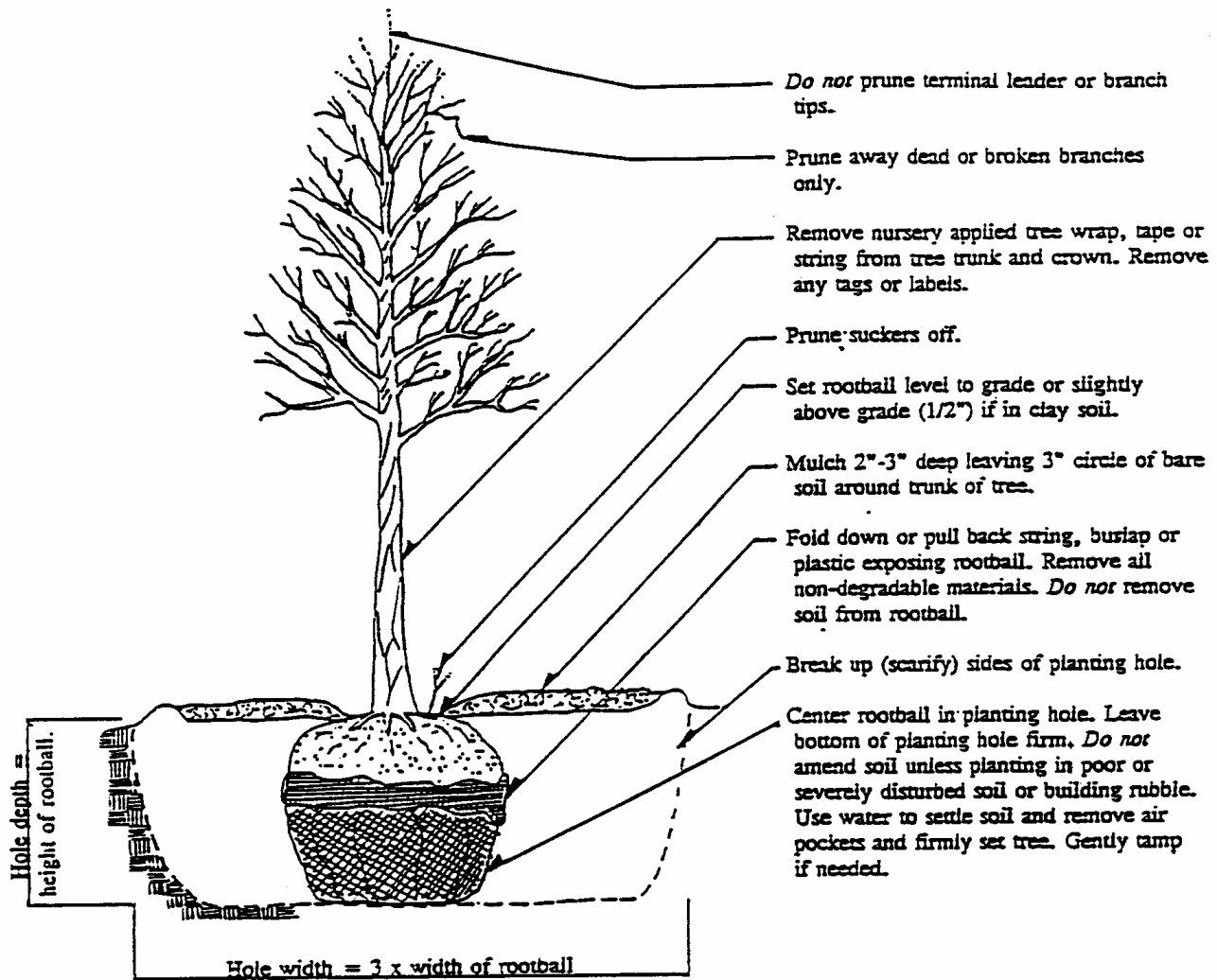

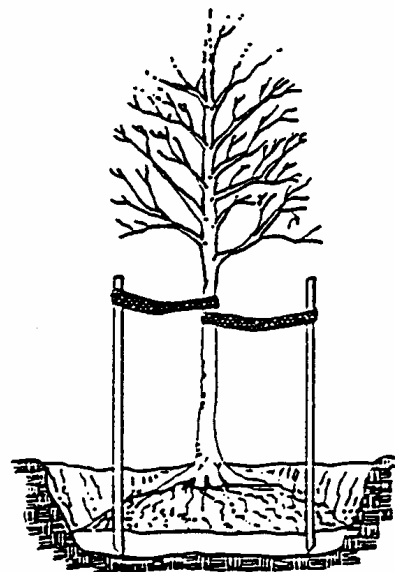

## APPENDIX C



*Do not stake unless in heavy clay soil, windy conditions, 3" or greater diameter tree trunk or large crown. If staking is needed due to these conditions:*

- Stake with 2 X 2 hardwood stakes or approved equal driven 6"-8" outside of rootball.
- Loosely stake tree trunk to allow for trunk flexing.
- Stake trees just *below* first branch with 2"-3" wide belt-like, nylon or plastic straps (2 per tree on opposite sides of tree, connect from tree to stake horizontally. *Do not* use rope or wire through a hose.)
- Remove all staking materials after 1 year.
