**12. Task Force Updated**

- a. E-Waste
  - i. FCC "A→D" fliers; about 6 boxes. Anyone is free to take and distribute as needed. See Dan Moody.
  - ii. Environmental Collection on Nov. 1 to help with TV disposal efforts. Cost of TVs has gone up tremendously (\$.11 to \$.55), so will be asking for \$10 donation per

person. Eastern is “donating” 8 student volunteers from a ‘green’ student organization.

b. Pharmaceutical Take-Back

- i. In Waste Watchers, Ann Arbor News, etc.: all featured information about new pharm. Take-back program. Trying to get word out to whole county. Received first invoice, and trying to get more pharmacies on board.
- ii. Are offering all pharmacies locked containers for security reasons. (HIPA) Also asking pharmacies to “black out” personal information.
- iii. Jeff says “All is going really well so far.”
- iv. Sharps disposal prices have gone up tremendously and many pharmacies are hurting from it.

c. Shrink Wrap

- i. Dan – Phil Bolyard from WWRA has expressed an interest in it and they also have bailer.
- ii. Met with Elizabeth LaPorte from Michigan Seagrant and she has offered help in developing literature advertising the program.
- iii. Program still in beginning stages, but is moving forward as more marinas and nurseries express interest in participating.

- a. Nancy – The Fall 2008/Winter 2009 Waste Watcher has been released.

- b. Nancy – Pencils made from recycled blue jeans passed out.
- c. Nancy – Have mtg. set up with Rebecca Warren regarding CFLs and mercury mandates. Putting together fact sheets that show how much Hg is used to sustain the life of an incandescent bulb vs. how much Hg is contained in a CFL.
- d. Chris – RHDC approved solar panels on the south of Ypsi City Hall. This is being funded by a grant.
- e. Dan – Toyota Technical Center just opened new LEED Certified Gold facility. Idea to tour facility for 2009 WCCSWM mtg.
