



Do Not Use Homemade Pacifiers

Homemade pacifiers are dangerous. Never make a pacifier from a nipple and plastic collar or ring. Some babies can separate the nipple from the collar and choke on it. Always use a store bought pacifier.

How to clean and care for pacifiers

- ★ Always use a store bought pacifier.
- ★ Clean a new pacifier with hot water and soap. Rinse and then boil in a an open pan of water for 10 minutes.
- ★ Wash your baby's pacifier each time you give it to your baby.
- ★ Do not wash the pacifier in the dishwasher.
- ★ Pacifiers can wear out with use. Test the pacifier before each use pulling on the bulb (the part that goes in the baby's mouth).
- ★ Throw it away if the bulb tears or separates from the base.
- ★ Do not use a pacifier if it becomes sticky, enlarged or cracked.
- ★ Do not put baby's pacifier in your mouth.
- ★ Never tie a cord to a pacifier. Your baby could strangle on the cord.



For your baby's safety, always use a store bought pacifier!
