



Immunization Fee Schedule

Effective January 1, 2012

Prices subject to change

The Washtenaw County Health Department is a Medicaid provider and must charge comparable fees to all participants. Our fees include an administration fee (\$10 for children and \$15 for adults) per injection *and* the cost of the vaccine(s).

Persons who are Vaccine For Children (VFC¹) Program eligible have the cost of their vaccine covered and will be charged administration fee(s) only (\$10 per injection).

The Public Health Dept does not bill private insurance; however, some insurance providers may reimburse you for some of the costs. We will give you a receipt, but it is your responsibility to contact your insurance company to determine coverage and request reimbursement.

¹ VFC Program vaccine shall be administered only to a child (18 years or younger) who is:

- Enrolled in Medicaid
- Has no insurance, or
- Is a Native American or Alaskan Native, or
- Receives services at Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) or a Rural Health Clinic and has health insurance that does not pay for the cost of the vaccine. (Public Health is an FQHC look alike).
