What is the Medical Reserve Corps?



The Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) brings together local health professionals and others with health-related skills to assist local, existing community emergency response systems.

Volunteers:

- Must be at least 18 years old with a valid photo I.D.
- Current licensure and U.S. citizenship are not required.
- Want to be asked to assist public health officials during an emergency.
- May be involved as much or as little as they would like.
- May participate in local drills and exercises such as mass prophylaxis, vaccination clinics and other emergency preparedness scenarios.
- *Participation is always voluntary.*
