Sharon distributed a state Tobacco Prevention newsletter with a lot of current stats on the cost and prevalence of ongoing tobacco use. She said a “patio exemption” bill was introduced in Michigan (#4127). Fran and Sharon were selected to participate on a statewide obesity prevention steering committee headed by MDCH’s Olga Dazzo. MDCH staff currently has a 10 year statewide obesity prevention/reduction plan which will be reviewed at the meeting. Hard copy format should continue to be “stand alone” which means much of the explanatory info in the existing format would continue. Current version is very wordy – less is more. Use more pictures, snappy heading, bullet points, more white space. Ensure we know who audience is and why we are doing the stories. At retreat several viewed key audience should be non health sector partners, educating them on why policy and environmental approaches. Stories should focus on PEC successes. Other idea: focus on successes that have occurred ‘within’ a partners organization such as UM implementing tobacco policy or SJMHS making healthy changes to food service.
