## Free prostate cancer screening June 21

Father's Day is around the corner. The best present is the gift of health. That's why we're encouraging men everywhere to be tested for prostate cancer.

Free prostate cancer screenings will be available Thursday, June 21, from 5-8 p.m.

Prostate cancer is the most common cancer in men. One in six men will develop prostate cancer at some point in their lives. But it can be cured, if it's detected early.

This disease has no symptoms at its earliest stages. That's why it's so important to get tested.

The screenings will be conducted in New Hope Outreach Clinic, 229 Chapin St., in Ann Arbor, Mich. Exams take less than 10 minutes and include a prostate-specific antigen blood test to determine cancer risk.

Who's at risk?

- All men who are 50 or older
- Men who are 40 or older with a family history of prostate cancer
- Men who are 40 or older and African American

To schedule a free screening, call the Cancer AnswerLine at (800) 865-1125. Registration is encouraged, but drop-ins are welcome. Space is limited. Men who have not had a PSA test within the past year are eligible.
