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RESOURCE REMEDIATION

The Resource Remediation Fund for the Washtenaw County Soil Erosion Control Program gives applicants for major grading permits the opportunity to contribute to a fund in lieu of being required to post a performance guarantee. This fund will be used for remediation of abandoned and badly polluted sites. Applicants who wish to participate are assessed an amount equal to 5% of the required performance guarantee. This payment will satisfy the applicant's requirement for posting a project guarantee and is not returned. The Resource Remediation Fund is a co-operative agreement between the applicant and the Soil Erosion Control Program. In exchange for allowing the applicant to work without a project bond, he/she must fulfill the following requirements meant to foster a more co-operative working atmosphere between the applicant and our office.

SECTION I

To Participate:

- 1) Be willing and able to work cooperatively with the SESC office. Provide a contact for the SESC program. The contact should be someone that will be on site and will be responsible for the soil erosion control measures.
- 2) Submit a detailed schedule of construction events.
- 3) Submit details of erosion controls. Periodic reporting of maintenance/review of erosion control measures will be required (see attached form).
- 4) If agreeable to you, the SESC office would like to use photos of your site in our information materials. Please read and complete the attached form.
- 5) Please review all of the materials attached and the SESC program guide. Sign the attached agreement.

SECTION II

Eligible to Participate:

- 1) The applicant must not have any more than two Stop Work Orders issued at any one site in the past two years, and must have properly remedied the violations within one week of the issue date of the Stop Work Order.
- 2) The applicant must not have been responsible for any sites within the past two years, for which Corporate Council had to be contacted in order to gain compliance from the site.
- 3) The applicant must not have been responsible for any site that has currently unresolved soil erosion control problems.
- 4) The applicant must not have been responsible for any projects for which Washtenaw County had to initiate subsequent final remediation.
- 5) The applicant must not have any outstanding problems with other federal, state, or local agencies due to non-compliance or violation(s) of regulation(s).
- 6) Each project applicant for participation in the Resource Remediation Fund will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

SECTION III

The Agreement

- 1) If determined to be necessary the applicant will attend at least one pre-construction/ education meeting with the Soil Erosion Office to go over special concerns for the site, and ways to best prevent those concerns from becoming problems. The meeting will also be used to discuss techniques used to lessen adverse environmental impacts during construction.

- 2) The applicant agrees to keep the site clean of excess sediment, and to adequately install and maintain all necessary soil erosion control measures. Failure to do so will result in a Stop Work Order being issued. If more than two Stop Work Orders at a site where a contribution to the Resource Remediation Fund was used, the Soil Erosion Control Office reserves the right to require a performance guarantee for the project, without a refund of the contribution.

- 3) To participate as outlined in Section I.

I have read and understand the conditions of this document and the Washtenaw County Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Program Guide. I agree to comply with the conditions set forth above, the Washtenaw County Soil Erosion and Sedimentation Control Program Guide and to all applicable laws/requirements of the State of Michigan and Washtenaw County.
